ARRIVALS

<u>Arrival Days</u>

- Rook Arrival Saturday, August 16th
 - 0800-1200, welcome ceremony is at 1430 (2:30 p.m.)
- Civilian Arrival Wednesday, August 20th
 - 0900-1100 is prime time, welcome ceremony is at 1330 (1:30 p.m.)
- Special Arrivals Athletics, International, FTX, Navy ROTC
 - Follow the direction of your coach

Transportation

- Charter transportation from the airport for solo air travelers through admissions by request.
- All other transport to campus is the responsibility of the student.

Checking In

- Start Ready Check with Admissions at first vehicle check point
 - Get Well Point
- Final check in is during move in at residence hall/barrack

Go Beyond

EARLY, AFTER-HOURS, ALTERNATE AND LATE ARRIVALS

Early Arrival – Date before your scheduled arrival date

After-hours Arrival – On the arrival day, after the arrival window

Alternate Arrival – After your arrival day but before start of classes

Late Arrival – After the start of classes

- Scheduled through your admissions counselor
- Must be approved (exceptions for delayed in route)
- Rooks can arrive no earlier than 10 AUG and no later than 16 AUG


