

PRE-HEALTHTRAG Pre-Dental Preparation

Dentistry is a highly competitive graduate program. Students should maintain a grade point average between 3.5-4.0, acquire leadership skills and exposure to the world of dentistry, and score an 18 or higher on the Dental Admission Test (DAT). Three letters of recommendation are required; generally two from the sciences and one of the student's choice. Typically, the DAT is taken during the Spring semester of the junior year and students apply through a centralized application service, the Associated American Dental Schools Application Services: AADSAS. The application is submitted in June between the junior and senior years. Dental schools are seeking individuals who are well-rounded in their educational backgrounds. When selecting a major, students should identify one that will prepare them best for dental practice or a backup plan. Biology, biochemistry, neuroscience, and health science are a few Norwich programs of study to consider. Below are the requirements to be considered for dentistry school admission.
